10:11 a.m. The Commission conducted a remote enforcement hearing for PDC Case 100925, David Strader, involving alleged violations of RCW 42.17A.145, .700 & .205, for false certification of statement and failure to timely and accurately file C-1 and F-1 reports within two weeks of becoming a candidate. Erick Agina, Compliance Officer, and Chad Standifer, Assistant Attorney General representing PDC Staff presented the case to the Commission for possible action.

Rulemaking Discussion | PDC Meeting Video

Kim Bradford, Deputy Director, presented for discussion and consideration possible inflationary adjustments to the limits and reporting thresholds in RCW 42.17A.

Deputy Director Bradford informed the Commission that they could move forward with a limited set of adjustments, or the Commission could wait until December 2022 for staff to do a complete review of the chapter and adjust several at once.

Chad Standifer, AAG and Commissioner Downing presented PDC Case 60811, concerning Respondent FedEx, involving allegations of violation of RCW 42.17A.345 and WAC 390-18-050, for failure to provide documents and books of account detailing the exact nature and extent of political advertising services rendered within 24 hours of request from any person. Commissioner Downing outlined the motion for summary judgment brought forth to the motion hearing in January 2022 and that the Commission was returning to the matter regarding the penalty.

<u>Chad Standifer</u>, Assistant Attorney General representing PDC staff, presented staff's brief regarding the penalty for PDC Case 60811, FedEx.

<u>Jim Frush</u> and <u>Eric Lindberg</u>, Counsel on behalf of FedEx Office, participated via video on Microsoft Teams.
