Declaratory Order Petition | PDC Meeting Video

General Counsel, Sean Flynn, discussed process for the declaratory order <u>petition</u> filed by Conner Edwards.

PDC Staff recommended that the Commission hold the petition for further discussion and possible action until the October 27, 2022, regular commission meeting. This would allow staff more time to evaluate the petition and consolidate the presentation along with the other filings by Edwards on same topic; including a petition for a rule amendment and a petition to convert agency interpretations to rule.

The Commission agreed to bring the matter back to the October 27, 2022, regular commission meeting for discussion and possible action.

Legislative Update | PDC Meeting Video

General Counsel, Sean Flynn, presented the PDC initial <u>draft agency-request legislation</u> for the Commission's consideration and possible approval to publish as draft legislation to be shared with the public, stakeholders and the Governor's office, soliciting feedback.

General Counsel Flynn highlighted some of the proposals and technical changes, such as the shifting of expenditure reporting, commercial advertising reporting, last minute contribution reporting, grassroots lobbying, and the non-appropriation of the transparency fund.

The Commission approved the initial draft to be published.
