Mr. Knezovich was found in violation of (1) <u>RCW 42.17A.555</u> by using the public facilities of the Spokane County Sheriff's Office to oppose Amber Waldref, a candidate for Spokane County Commissioner in the 2022 election; and (2) <u>RCW 42.17A.635(2)</u> for engaging in prohibited indirect lobbying by encouraging members of the public to contact legislators regarding legislative changes. Mr. Knezovich was assessed a penalty of \$300, with \$100 suspended, which he now asks the Commission to reconsider.
