Reason(s) for Modification (as stated by filer)	 Wesley Finchum is requesting a partial reporting modification that would exempt him from disclosing information connected to a student loan debt that would otherwise be reportable during the twelve months prior to his candidacy. Mr. Finchum stated that this loan is part of a spousal consolidation loan pending future separation per the Joint Consolidation Loan Separation Act (JCLSA) and that if he reported the loan in its current state, the amount would appear higher than the actual amount owed; therefore, the F-1 would be incorrect. Mr. Finchum further stated that his participation in the JCLSA is affected by his public service because he is earning credit toward the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program. He stated that this further inflates the amount owed for his student loan debt, as his years of public service will reduce the amount finally due.
Other Issues	 Mr. Finchum has agreed to recuse himself if a matter came before him involving a conflict of interest between his personal finances and his official duties with the Port of Camas-Washougal, if elected. PDC staff have informed Mr. Finchum of the information required for the disclosure of debts owed on the F-1 report, including the ability to categorize the amount owed using a range for the dollar amount. Mr. Finchum has disclosed all other reportable financial information on his F-1 report.
